
What will I learn about?

- The assignment will be completed in approximately 4 hours of monitored preparation and 6 hours of supervised assessment and worth 60 marks.




What will I learn about?

- Non-exam internal assessment set by Pearson, marked internally and moderated by Pearson.
- The assignment will be completed in approximately 5 hours of monitored preparation and 6 hours of supervised assessment and worth 60 marks



What will I learn about?


- Component 3: Influences on Global Travel and Tourism
- External assessment (exam) set and marked by Pearson, completed under supervised conditions.
- The assessment will be completed in 2 hours and worth 60 marks.
